

Trip to Venezuela

The Coastal Cordillera, Andean Foothills and the Llanos (plains).

November 7-14, 1999

Led by David Ascanio

This report contains the species of Birds, Mammals and Reptiles seen in the November 1999 Venezuela tour. The add of the Andean foothills in one morning introduced the participants to this complex and impressive set of mountains.

It was also a good time to learn about birds and it's habitats. We covered Tropical dry and moist forest, Premontane humid and wet forest (more known as Cloud Forest), Gallery Forest, Thorny shrubs, Scrub woodland, Grassland, Mata and Wetlands.

Other memorable experiences includes a sighting of an Orinocoan Crocodile, Nine-banded Armadillo and a Black-collared Hawk searching after the boat driver Piranha!

The English and Latin names are accompanied by three columns. The first one shows the localities where the species was reported. The second indicates an estimated number of individuals seen. For those ones only heard it have been indicated with an "H". If the species have been either seen and heard, we estimate the total number of individuals. The third column indicates detailed or important information regarding the report.

The list of birds follows the nomenclature of De Schauensee and Phelps in "A Guide to the Birds of Venezuela", although recent changes are also followed. In the case of taxonomic split followed by new English name, the old English name is written into brackets followed by the new Latin name. Species underlined means of special interest for next tour since the report is fairly new.

It was a great pleasure to be your leader. We hope to see you again in another venezuelan experience, could be hiking in the forest of the Orinoco Delta, driving throughout the paramo zone in search for high Andean specialists or birding in the rain in a country like Venezuela filled with enchanting, bizarre and beautiful birds.

Key for localities:

(CC) Coastal Cordillera / November 7-9.

Colonia Tovar, La Victoria Road, Macarao and Henri Pittier National parks (Rancho Grande, Choroni Road, Ocumare Road). Habitats covered: wet, humid & moist premontane forest, dry tropical forest, secondary growth, farmland and park. Elevation ranged from 1200 ft at La Victoria to 6600 ft in Macarao National Park.

(AD) Andes of Barinas / November 10.

Altamira. Habitat: Premontane humid forest, coffee plantation, secondary growth. Elevation: 2400 ft.

(LL) Llanos of Apure / November 10-13

Hato El Cedral (Matiyure River, Caicara River, Sabanas de Aroa medio), Puerto de Nutrias and Bruzual. Habitats covered: patches of dry tropical forest, grasslands, pastures and farmland, river, gallery forest, savannas of native Andropogon

bicornis, scrub and mata. Elevation ranged from 600 ft in Barinas to 240 ft in Hato El Cedral.
